**Fees for the Use of Park and Recreation Area
Facilities and Services**

1 The following apply to the fees and specific facilities and services listed in the Appendix of Fees:

- (a) the Goods and Service Tax (GST) is included in all fees except for overnight use of cabin accommodation by a party that is GST exempt;
- (b) the fee for the overnight use of dock and mooring buoy facilities applies to vessels that tie or anchor to another vessel using the dock or mooring buoy facilities;
- (c) the fee for backcountry camping or overnight use of cabin accommodation does not apply to children under 13 years of age;
- (d) the west side of the Bowron Lake Circuit means Bowron Lake, Spectacle Lakes, Skoi Lake, Babcock Lake and Unna Lake;
- (e) the annual fee (January 1 to December 31 of each year) for access by vessel applies to Cinnemousun Narrows, Silver Beach, Shuswap Lake Marine (Multi-Site) and Anstey-Hunakwa Parks;
- (f) Repealed. [B.C. Reg. 350/2000, s. 3 (b).]
- (g) the fee for group camping in a park is either \$50/night or

the amount calculated using the per party rate listed in the Appendix of Fees, whichever is more.

2 (1) The fee for a Recreation Stewardship Annual Pass, which allows for its duration free parking

(a) for a vehicle other than a bus in the frontcountry, is \$50, and

(b) for a bus in the frontcountry is \$50 until December 31, 2004.

(1.1) Commencing January 1, 2005, the fee for a Bus Annual Pass, which allows for its duration unlimited parking for a bus in the frontcountry, is \$250.

(1.2) Commencing April 1, 2005, the fee for a bus other than a school bus to park at Mount Robson Provincial Park or frontcountry where vehicle parking fees are collected is \$25 a day if that bus does not display a Bus Annual Pass.

(2) The fee for vehicle parking in the frontcountry without displaying either a current Recreation Stewardship Annual Pass or a valid receipt for overnight camping in that park is \$1 for one hour or less, or \$3 a day at the following parks:

Part 5 — Interpretation

1 (1) For the purposes of this Schedule,

(a) measurements expressed in hectares must be rounded upwards to the next whole hectare and measurements

expressed in square metres or cubic metres are rounded upwards to the next whole square metre or cubic metre, and
(b) measurements expressed in square metres of any structure must be based on the outside dimensions including verandahs or porches.

(2) In this Schedule:

"base facility" means a facility that is the main location or one of the main locations for a commercial or industrial operation;

"defined" means an area specified in the park use permit or resource use permit for which the fee is payable;

"minor shoot" means commercial filming taking one day at one location with no disturbance of the users or natural resources of a park, conservancy or recreation area;

"non-profit organization" means a club or association incorporated pursuant to the *Society Act* or a school board incorporated under the *School Act*, in which the use or activity undertaken is

- (a) of demonstrable benefit to the whole community, and
- (b) consistent with the approved objectives of the park, conservancy or recreation area;

"satellite facility" means a facility with one permanent structure, excluding pit toilets, that is used for temporary accommodation, storage of supplies or fuel, or as an emergency shelter or an improved helicopter landing site;

"structure" means any building or permanent improvement constructed, placed or established on *Park Act* lands, excluding pit toilets;

"tent/spike camp" means a site with no permanent improvements or structures used on a non-exclusive basis for temporary tenting accommodation or the storage of supplies;

"trapping cabin" means a cabin used for shelter and for storage of trapping supplies on a periodic but temporary basis in conjunction with the operation of a trapline.
